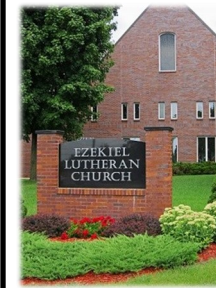

Jesus Christ is the living and abiding Word of God. By the power of the Spirit, this very Word of God, which is Jesus Christ, is read in the Scriptures, proclaimed in preaching, announced in the forgiveness of sins, eaten and drunk in the Holy Communion, and encountered in the bodily presence of the Christian community. By the power of the Spirit active in Holy Baptism, this Word washes a people to be Christ's own Body in the world. We have called this gift of Word and Sacrament by the name "the means of grace." The living heart of all these means is the presence of Jesus Christ through the power of the Spirit as the gift of God.

During the Lenten season, a group of us has been studying the document, *The Use of the Means of Grace*. I believe that those gathered had been enriched by the study and enriched by the conversation and questions that are asked during the sessions. Even though Lent is over, we will still have a couple more sessions in April to finish the document. You are welcome to join us for these final sessions and you can watch each session on Ezekiel's YouTube channel.

In worship, God promises to meet us through the means of grace. As you reflect on the paragraph from the document, notice how everything we do in worship is meant to help us experience God's grace not only in that moment but in our lives as well.

You've heard me talk about community and relationship and when we participate in the means of grace, we build and strengthen our relationship with God and one another. This strengthening of relationship builds our community as well. It is, if you will, weightbearing exercise for the body of Christ. Like weightbearing exercise, worship is meant to improve our balance, strengthen our stride, deepen our breathing, and tone our body for service in this world.

This is why we call liturgy the "work of the people." When we gather for worship, there is work to do and amid this work God not only promises to meet us, but God promises to lavish on us God's grace. I do believe that the people who have joined in the class will approach worship in a new way. I invite you to be open to the ways God is reaching out to you in worship and the ways that God is working to build up this body that we call Ezekiel.

Teen and Young Adult MINISTRIES

I was recently asked the question, 'What do I tell my young person when they ask why they need to go to church on Sundays or Wednesdays?' Luckily, this came in an email, so I had some time to reflect on my response. My suggestion to the adult was to share what brings them to church throughout the week. Personally, I know my grandma attends church for the music, my mother for community, and my father for the message of Christ's resurrection.

Opening a dialogue about why we are here can help young people understand why their trusted adults go to a place that many deem 'uncool' or 'too traditional.' Now, I'm not saying we need to invest in a light show and smoke machine because these will make young people feel at home, but having a conversation about why you as an adult attend is important.

We should not have higher expectations of our young people simply because 'it's something you need to do.' Often, we think that young people need to acolyte because 'that's the way things have always been,' and although this may be true in recent history, I fear that is not enough of a response for our young people. We have raised younger generations to be critical thinkers and evaluate the purpose of where they spend their time. What if we shared with young people our 'why' and had a conversation about where they see themselves fitting in (or possibly even growing and transforming our space to reflect the unique needs of our changing population)?

There are a variety of reasons why we gather in this space, many of which are rooted in scripture. Psalm 102:22 calls us to corporate worship. Acts 2:46 speaks to the reasons to gather and break bread together. Psalms 33:3 calls us to gather to praise God with instruments, new songs, and loud shouts. Instead of expressing frustration when young people question us, I encourage *us* to reflect on what brings us to church.
